The sustainable protection minimises the impact on the environment caused by plastic guards whilst the hedgerows increase habitat connectivity and minimise water run off. Across these four parks, new infrastructure will be developed and contributions will be made to the Lullingstone Discovery Trail, Shorne Woods Sculpture Trail and the Access for All Trail. There will be wider AONB interpretation panels at all four parks, promoting access to the Kent Downs AONB landscape. Two new Changing Spaces facilities will be installed at two of the parks, enabling visits from an even wider audience. Planting the avenue will enhance and reinforce the quality and character of the landscape and will bring the parkland landscape together linking the heritage of the once Badlesmere Castle, which was sited within the parkland landscape. The planting will create a wildlife corridor, increasing biodiversity and linking the wildlife in the church yard with the wooded shaw at the other end of the road.
